# Minutes of the Meeting of Bradpole Parish Council held at Bradpole Village Hall on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2022 at 7.30pm

## 2. Declarations of Interest and Grants of Dispensation

#### 3. Minutes of Meeting held on 6th October 2022

Minutes taken as read. Cllr Baker asked if the minutes should be signed as a true record of the meeting.

## 4. Matters Arising from 6<sup>th</sup> October 2022 Minutes

- a) Community Governance Review to receive any new information the Clerk advised that as of 31<sup>st</sup> October, Dorset Council were unable to provide a date for circulation of the CGR Reorganisation Order.
- **b)** Replacement of Swings and Wet Pour Surface the Deputy Clerk advised that the project was taking longer than expected due to contractor manpower shortages but confirmed that the swings had been installed and the site was now being prepared for the new wet pour surface.
- c) Village Hall AGM Cllr W Smart provided the following information from the Village Hall AGM:
  - the Village Hall Management Committee are concerned about the costs of running the village hall when Bradpole Parish Council is abolished in 2024 as the council is a key income stream for the hall;
  - currently the village hall is financially sound;
  - new trustees have been appointed;
  - the village hall is in the process of being registered;
  - maintenance work on the hall is being undertaken as required.
- **d) BLAP Funding Contribution Request 2023-24** Cllr Everall and Cllr A Smart as the Parish Council's BLAP representatives confirmed that they were happy that the council contribute £202.38 to the running costs of BLAP for 2023/24.

- c) BTC Bridport Investment Plan Draft the draft had previously been circulated to Councillors who felt that the plan had lots of ambitious ideas but raised the question where would the money come from to fund the ideas and were any of the projects based in Bradpole? It was confirmed that the Parish Council have until the end of November to submit comments on the draft Bridport Investment Plan.
- d) Request from Pymore Village Management Committee for extra funding for reed bed clearing works the Clerk advised that as the Parish Council had already paid out its allocated community funds, it was unable to contribute anymore funds to the reed bed clearing works. All agreed.
- e) To consider any correspondence received after published agenda -
  - Village Road the Clerk advised Cllr Clayton that a resident had first reported the issue of overhanging branches on the pavement of Village Road backing onto properties in Drew Close in May 2021. Work to cut the tops of the trees was due to take place this Autumn but is still outstanding. Cllr Clayton agreed to chase up.
  - Overgrown hedges a resident had contacted the council regarding overgrown hedges on footpaths in the parish. The Clerk advised the resident that the hedges were the responsibility of Dorset Council and provided the resident with the necessary online link to report the issue to Dorset Council.
  - Notices at Spray Copse Farm the Clerk confirmed that Dorset Council have circulated notices confirming the public path diversion order and public path extinguishment order at Spray Copse Farm.
